## 2014-2015 Season

Mission Statement – The Portland Peace Choir strives to exemplify the principles of peace, equality, justice, stewardship of the Earth, unity and cooperation. We sing music from diverse cultures and traditions to inspire peace in ourselves, our families, our communities, and the world. The Portland Peace Choir welcomes all voices.

There are no auditions necessary to join the Peace Choir and all experience and skill levels are welcome. (Please help us grow! Basses and tenors are especially needed. Invite your friends to join us. Become a fan on Facebook.)

Rehearsals – We sing between Labor Day and Memorial Day. Fall term is 9/3 to 12/17. We end the term with a potluck party, which will be in December. Spring term is 1/7 to 5/20 with a year-end potluck in late May or early June. There are opportunities to sing during the summer, which is always optional.

We meet on Wednesdays from 7-9pm at St. David of Wales Episcopal Church, 2800 SE Harrison (97214), between Hawthorne & Division. Doors open at 6:30. Please be seated and ready to sing at 7:00. Parking is available in the church parking lot. We encourage you to car pool or use public transit. (We are not associated with the church or other any religious organization. We simply rent rehearsal and performance space.)

Visitors – Prospective singers are welcome to attend one rehearsal at no charge before joining.

Attendance – Sign in at the beginning of each rehearsal. Singers are expected to attend at least 75% of all rehearsals and to participate in performances.

Young Folks – We welcome middle schoolers (6<sup>th</sup> grade & up) accompanied by an adult. High school students are welcome to join on their own.

Choir Pals – New singers are paired with established members in their section to help learn what to expect, and to feel welcome.

<u>Happy Half Hour</u> – 6:30 pm, 1<sup>st</sup> Wednesday of the month. Happy Half Hour is the time we meet for snacking and socializing before a rehearsal. Each month is hosted by a different section that brings food and drink - and often a fun song for the rest of us to hear!

<u>Dues</u> – dues are \$225 for the September - May season, with two payment options. Pay \$25/ month, or \$200 for the full year by October 3rd to save \$25. Singers who choose to participate in the June/July rehearsals/performance pay another month's dues. Dues are given to Peter Lofy (Treasurer) or Sandy Lofy at the sign-in table. <u>Checks are made payable to Portland Peace Choir</u>. If you need scholarship assistance, please talk to Peter. So that all can participate, we encourage those who can to give a little extra to the Mike Tinkham Scholarship Fund. (Mike was an original member of PPC who greatly enjoyed the music and the choir community. After he passed away, this fund was set up in his memory as a way to help others experience the same joy.)

<u>Performances</u> – Call time is usually 30-60 minutes before most gigs and 90 minutes before the concert. Bring sure to bring water, and dinner or a snack if needed. Attendance at the four practices prior to our concert will ensure your comfort and the choir's performance confidence.

Performance attire is shades of white with scarves and jewelry of different accent colors. Shoes can be any color.

<u>Music Memorization</u> – Performances are off-book. Memorizing songs provides an expanded experience of the music and a greater connection to the audience.
Practice audio tracks for each section are available to download free via the Green Room on our website <a href="www.portlandpeacechoir.org">www.portlandpeacechoir.org</a> . The PASSWORD is For those without convenient computer access, the Music Librarian will burn practice CDs of your tracks on request.
<u>Music Selection</u> – Pieces are selected ahead of time each year by the Music Committee. All choir members are encouraged to submit music at any time for consideration (put in the envelope on the attendance table, ideally sheet music; or send a recording or YouTube link to Music Committee Chair: <a href="mailto:davedwards72@gmail.com">davedwards72@gmail.com</a> ).
<u>Sectional Rehearsals</u> – On most 2nd, 3rd, and 4th Wednesdays, a different section meets alone with David to go over particular songs that need extra work.
